Home Again Program

Financial Assistance for Seniors (55+) or Families with small children - under 18 years of age

Qualified individuals may be eligible for a <u>one-time</u> financial assistance of <u>up to</u> \$3000.

This assistance may be used to help cover the cost of Past-Due Rent / Mortgage,

Move-in costs (first month's rent, security deposit, application fees) or past-due Utility Bills.

Qualifications:

- Must be a Senior Citizen at least 55 years old.
- · OR- have children who are under 18 years of age
- Must have a current lease in your name
- Must NOT be receiving any other type of subsidy (i.e. Atlanta Housing Voucher)
- Must have combined Income less than 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI) for the city of Atlanta*
- Must reside within one of the zip codes located within the City of Atlanta: (see map)



*80% AMI for a ONE-person household is \$57,000

Please note:

Zip codes **30316**, **30317**, **30331**, and **30354** may cross city lines. It is important to ask the landlord what city they pay taxes to

- It MUST be the City of Atlanta.

To apply:

If you are interested in applying to the Home Again Program, you will need to provide <u>all</u> the following documentation to HOPE Atlanta. Please note: We are only able to accept applications with <u>complete</u> documentation. **Packets with missing information will not be accepted.

Document Requirements:

- ☐ ID and Social Security Cards for all family members (Birth Certificate is okay for minors)
- ☐ Copy of your current lease (showing that you reside in one of the above zip codes in the City of Atlanta)
- ☐ Income Verification Documentation <u>for the past 60 days</u>
- ☐ Demonstration of Need which may be a least one and/or more of the following:
- Current Ledger
- Past Due Notice (past due rent or utility)
- o Eviction Letter

McAuley Station - Now Open! 375 Gartrell Street SE, Atlanta, GA, 30312

McAuley Station is a brand new mixed-income, family rental community in southeast Atlanta, developed in partnership with Mercy Care. The 170-unit, energy-efficient development is adjacent to Mercy Care's facility that is undergoing an expansion and features studio, one- and two-bedroom apartment homes available at a variety of income tiers (ranging from 30% to 80% AMI).

Residents will enjoy a rooftop deck with scenic views of downtown Atlanta, inviting resident lounges, fitness center, and business center. The community is walkable to the Atlanta Beltline, King Memorial MARTA Station, Martin Luther King Jr. Natatorium, and tons of shops, restaurants, bars, and other local amenities. It is minutes from downtown Atlanta, with easy access to major highways and the Memorial Drive corridor.

PROGRAMS AND ELIGIBILITY

Program requirements are specific to the property and individual unit. Eligibility for programs depends on several factors including: the number of people in the household, the total annual household income, credit and criminal background screening, and other criteria. McAuley Station offers the following rent programs: Low-Income Housing Tax Credit, HOME Program, Housing Trust Fund
